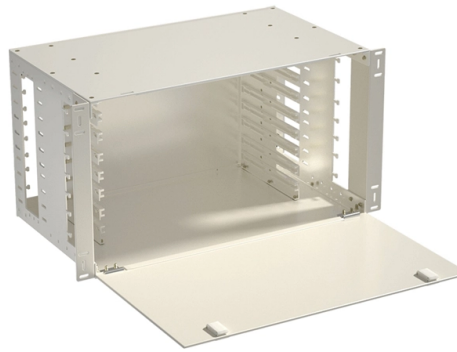


Do the distribution box and equipment share a common ground

Common grounding refers to the practice where a system's functional (working) grounding, equipment protective grounding, and lightning protection grounding share a single grounding electrode system. Alternatively, it may mean that grounding conductors from multiple electrical devices are connected. Common Grounding is the interconnection between the grounding system of different electrical systems, devices, and machines that provides a common path for all to flow the fault current to the ground.
