

How far away do cable trays need reinforcement supports



Overview

When transitioning cables from a tray to equipment or another raceway, the unsupported span cannot exceed 6 feet. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency. The cable manufacturer's recommended minimum bending radii for the specific. The primary rulebook used in the safe use of cable trays is NEC Article 392. Unlike a simple wire trough, which is typically a covered channel for shorter runs, cable trays provide a comprehensive support system for complex wiring paths over long. This publication is intended as a practical guide for the proper and safe* installation of cable ladder systems, cable tray systems, channel support systems and associated supports. Cable ladder systems and cable tray systems shall be manufactured in accordance with BS EN 61537, channel support.
