

What to do if the fiber optic patch cord is reversed



Overview

Replace the patch cord type (for example, switching from an A-B to an A-A patch cord) to realign the Tx/Rx pathways. Another method is to use polarity-flipping MTP®/MPO Pro cables that reverse the fiber positions without requiring physical rewiring. Good news: it's incredibly easy to understand and fix once you know the “two-lane highway” rule. Fiber is full-duplex, which means it always uses. Optical fiber shall be installed with odd numbered fibers having Position A at one end and Position B at the other. If the fibers are not crossed in the permanent cable plant, one duplex patch cord in the link. Since fiber optic links require a two-way - or duplex - connection, there is potential for errors in installation by connecting transmitter to transmitter or receiver to receiver. To help address polarity issues, TIA published polarity connectivity methods in the mid 2000s to help installers. Thus, when connecting patchcords, fiber 1 (or the odd numbered fibers) can always go to the transmitter and fiber 2 (or all even numbered fibers) goes to a receiver and proper connectivity is maintained, allowing the use of straight through duplex patch cords. To maintain a proper signal, standard A-to-B duplex patch cables are employed on both sides of the link.
